MCH Certificate Program The 12-month MCH Certificate program provides an MCH credential to State, Local and Tribal practitioners interested in maternal and child health. This program offers MCH professionals the opportunities to enhance their scholarship, leadership and partnership skills. Public health professionals with bachelor's degrees are encouraged to apply.

Master of Public Health in Maternal and Child Health The University of Arizona in collaboration with the RMPHEC provides graduate training in MCH with scholarships available.
